THREE CHURCHES IN YORK, PA, TO BE SITES OF NEXT ANNUAL MEETING

The 128th Annual Meeting of the Evangelical and Reformed Historical Society will take place October 17, 1992, at three congregations in York, Pennsylvania, who are this year celebrating major anniversaries: Heidelberg United Church of Christ (125th), Trinity United Church of Christ (250th), and Zion United Church of Christ (250th). featured speaker for the occasion will be the Rev. Dr. Benjamin T. Griffin, President of United Theological Seminary, New Brighton, Minnesota, and former pastor of Trinity United Church of Christ, York. He will present an address on the topic, "Origins and Development of the Reformed Church in York County."

Block reservations are being held for Friday night, October 16, at the Yorktowne Hotel, 48 E. Market Street, York, PA 17401, (717) 848-1111. The deadline for reservations is Friday, September 25. Please make reservations directly with the hotel. Luncheon reservations may be made with Trinity United Church of Christ, 32 W. Market St., York, PA 17401. The cost of the luncheon is \$5.00.

The Board of Directors will eat together for dinner at 6:00 P.M. at the Yorktowne Hotel and hold their annual business meeting immediately afterwards in the same place. (The schedule for the meeting is as listed on page three.)

HISTORICAL COUNCIL MEETING AT UCC CLEVELAND HEADQUARTERS

The United Church of Christ Historical Council will hold its next meeting September 18-20, 1992, in Cleveland, Ohio. Business sessions will be at the headquarters building and at the Sheraton City Center.

Highlight of the meeting will be an address by UCC President Paul H. Sherry on the history of the denomination. The lecture will be held at 3 P.M. on Friday, September 18, in the ninth floor conference room of the 700 Prospect Avenue building. A reception will follow the lecture. National staff persons and local church members are invited to attend this event as well as all other sessions of the Council.

Business sessions will take place on Friday afternoon from 1 to 3 P.M.; on Friday night from 7-9:30; on Saturday from 9 to 12 and from 1 to 4:30; and will conclude on Sunday morning.

On Saturday afternoon at 4:30 P.M., Council members will leave for tours of Zion and Pilgrim churches in Cleveland and continue on to dinner at Pilgrim Congregational United Church of Christ and an evening program there. The public is invited to attend the drama at Pilgrim Church which will begin at 7:30 P.M. MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, APRIL 25, 1992

After meeting for lunch in the Seminary Refectory, the Board gathered in the Archives Room. The meeting was called to order by President John Payne with an opening prayer.

Present: Payne, Zuck, Bricker, Wolf, Schellhase, Hutchens.

The minutes of the Board of Directors October meeting were approved as written.

Frank Snider and Banks Shepherd regretted they were unable to attend today's meeting.

The Rev. Robert Anderson of York was welcomed; Revs. Pocker and Korinth were unable to be present. The Board discussed the October 17, 1992, meeting plans for York, PA. (Agenda for Meeting is outlined on Page 3)

Participants in the meeting are asked to park at Heidelberg Church. Bob Anderson will invite a Conference official to bring greetings to the group and will advertise the meeting in regional Conference News editions.

The Board of Directors will need a place for dinner and evening meetings on Friday, October 16. Bob Anderson was asked to reserve 10 rooms and a meeting site for 15 persons. He will contact John Payne with further details.

President Payne reported:

- a. He and Lowell Zuck are working on the Living Theological Heritage of the UCC. Projected printing of Vol. 1-3, 1994.
- b. He has written an article on John Nevin and the Mercersburg Theology for the <u>Lutheran Forum</u> (May issue).
- c. His article on Schaff/Nevin will appear in the June issue of <u>Church History</u>.
- d. He will give a presentation on Mercersburg Theology to the Education Division of the United Church Board for Homeland Ministries at their meeting in Mercersburg, June 11-13.
- e. He will participate in the Penn Central UCC/EKU trip to Germany, Summer 1992.
- f. The Society Newsletter has resulted in a membership increase. Arcadia Foundation has contributed \$1,000 more to the Society. First Reformed UCC, Lancaster, has given a \$2,500 microfilm reader to the Society.

Archivist Kay Schellhase reported:

- a. She has just returned from a visit to the well-kept archives at Heidelberg College.
- b. The UCC Historical Council will consider the question of local church record-keeping at its next meeting. Meanwhile, local churches celebrating their 25-year incremental anniversaries will be sent forms on which they can inventory their own records. (Cont'd on Page Four)

- c. She will attend the CCHS meeting on May 1 and 2, speak to the Connecticut Conference History Committee and visit the Congregational Library in Boston and the Houghton Library at Harvard.
- d. The protest regarding fifteen days research per year in the archives has been resolved.
- e. The membership renewal reminder in the newsletter has encouraged recent members to renew but has not affected those whose memberships have been lapsed for many years.
- f. Statistical information for Genealogical Research Letters in 1990 and 1991:
 - 762 letters were received. Real help given to 137.

 No Help to 256. Good Advice given to 369.
- g. Society Leaflet needs to be reprinted with new data, membership categories and in another color.
- h. Society has received the Kollwitz Sculpture. The Board discussed a possible lecture and display.
- i. She serves on a small committee for art and historical displays for the UCC building in Cleveland.

Treasurer Myron Wolf presented the treasurer's report, noting significant changes. Discussion ensued regarding investments in money markets and CD's. Treasurer will request a letter from the Wellington Fund.

Banks Shepherd sent a Southern Chapter Report. The Board discussed issue of the archival storage of records of the former Christian Churches in Southern Conference and suggested that further talks be held with Rollin Russell, Banks Shepherd and George Gay: it was suggested that contact be made with the UCC Historical Council rather than ERHS. Southern Chapter hopes to charter a bus to the York meeting.

Lowell Zuck reported that the Eden Archives is becoming more closely tied to Eden Seminary. A new brochure outlining its purpose and services was shared with the Board.

The Rev. Robert Rezash, Houston, TX, has invited the ERHS to hold its 1998 annual meeting at St. Peter Church when it observes its 150th Anniversary. President Payne will respond that we will consider the invitation and will make a final decision by 1995.

The meeting adjourned at 3:50.
